What is Flash Fiction?

Flash fiction is a **complete story that is usually 1500 to 500 words**. However, it does contain **a complete narrative arc including a beginning, middle and end**. Micro fiction is flash fiction under 500 words.

This form of writing is usually for online viewing. I have included several links that have free flash fictions for you to choose from. There are some anthologies out there. The RCC has a couple of books that have flash fiction alongside essays and poetry. (see below)

For RCC Summer Book Bingo you may read flash or micro fiction. You **only need to read one piece of flash fiction** in the anthology, magazine or the online site to fulfill the Bingo prompt. However, they are a perfect little break on a busy day.

Don't forget that a **lot of fan fiction is flash fiction**. If it is serial fiction (published or posted in installments) it does not count, unless the story is complete and under 1500 words.

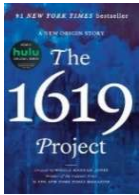
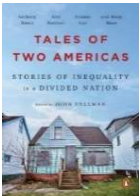
Remember: to be considered flash fiction it must have a complete narrative within the 1500 or less words parameter.
